# High Performance

Sport Ireland's vision for High Performance Sport is Ireland consistently achieving podium success on the world stage, inspiring the nation and future generations. We aim to achieve this vision through systemic and sustainable results, led by National Governing Bodies and their High Performance Programmes.

## High Performance Funding

---

High Performance Programme Funding is provided to National Governing Bodies to support the delivery of their performance programmes. This funding supports a range of activities including training camps and competitions, pathway development, performance services and performance team salaries. These programmes are central to supporting Irish athletes and teams in reaching finals and achieving medals at European & World Championships, Olympic & Paralympic Games.

## High Performance Strategy 2021-2032

The commitments to high performance sport identified in the National Sports Policy 2018-2027 provide a significant increase in funding throughout the Paris cycle. Sport Ireland will provide funding to the high performance system in a manner which reflects the mandate of the Sport Ireland High Performance Strategy 2021-2032. Sport Ireland's investment across the high performance system is an important step-change in support and aims to facilitate the achievement of the Strategy's performance targets. The High Performance Strategy places an emphasis on targeting resources at priority and medal potential sports and improving the capability and capacity of the system to develop and support our athletes.

## Multi-Annual Commitment

National Governing Bodies have been approved multi-annual funding from 2022 to 2024. This funding package also recognises the investment provided to NGBs in year one (2021) of the Paris 2024 Cycle.

Sport Ireland acknowledge that increased and multi-annual funding present an enhanced expectation on NGBs across governance, performance, and programme delivery.

# 2022 International Carding Scheme

The International Carding Scheme provides financial support to athletes for their training and competition programmes. The primary purpose of this funding is to support Irish athletes in reaching finals and achieving medals at European, World, Olympic and Paralympic level.

In 2022, Sport Ireland will invest €3,080,500 under the International Carding Scheme. This will support 112 athletes and 10 relays/squads, across 16 sports.

Sport Ireland have introduced a series of advancements to the International Carding Scheme. These are in line with the objective of the Sport High Performance Strategy 2021-2032 and include:

1. Increased funding to athletes at International Level from €12,000 to €18,000
2. Increase funding to athletes at World Class Level from €20,000 to €25,000
3. Multi Annual Funding in 2023 and 2024
4. Athlete Career Transition Programme which provides a continuation of financial and services support to athletes upon retirement

## Highlights of the 2022 International Carding Scheme

- 19 athletes have been awarded the top category of Podium Level funding including all Olympic and Paralympic Medallists.
- 31 athletes will receive World Class Level funding
- 62 athletes will receive International Level funding.
- In the sports of Athletics, Badminton, Cycling, Gymnastics, Rowing and Swimming, pool funding and/or relay funding will be provided to support a broad number of athletes.
- 22 athletes from 8 sports have been approved on the Athlete Career Transition Programme in 2021 and 2022. Athletes engaging in this Programme in 2022 will receive 50% of their 2022 Carding Award and a continuation of services support from Sport Ireland Institute, upon retirement.
- Due to the reduced competitions in 2021, Sport Ireland permitted NGBs to nominate athletes for support under the International Carding Scheme who did not achieve criteria, but competed in the Tokyo Olympic/Paralympic Games, and were considered high potential for Paris 2024. Recognising Sport Ireland's continued commitment to our athletes, 19 individuals will receive funding in 2022 under this criteria. These athletes will be guaranteed 75% of their Award with the remaining 25% dependent on the achievement of Carding Criteria during 2022.
