9 OPEN/ MIXED High Performance Investment 2021-2024

Sport Ireland's investment in high performance sport is directed by the High Performance Strategy 2021-2032, which targets the achievement of medals at major international events, including the Olympic Games and Paralympic Games. There was a record €89m of high performance investment across the Paris Cycle (2021-2024), which was a significant increase on the €59m invested for the Tokyo Cycle (2017-2020).

Sport Ireland invested over €25m in High Performance Sport in 2024 (including the Sport Ireland Institute - €4.2m). This investment included:

High Performance Programme Funding - €10,886,662

Direct Athlete Support (Including the International Carding Scheme) - €4,667,400

2024 High Performance Impact Funding and Paris 2024 Funding - €2,225,955

2025-2028 High Performance Funding

€27m will be invested in high performance sport in 2025. Sport Ireland and the Government of Ireland is on track to achieve the targeted investment levels of €30m during the lifetime of the National Sports Policy 2018-2027. On the back of significant performance success and the achievement of key strategic milestones, the high performance system has now entered a new phase. The LA Cycle presents a renewed opportunity for further performance and system success, as well as a new level of expectation, accountability, and responsibility.

High Performance Programme Funding is the central component of Sport Ireland's investment in high performance sport. This funding supports National Governing Bodies (NGBs) to deliver their high performance programmes, which includes training camps, international competitions, centralised training costs, staff salaries, and senior and pathway athlete supports.


Sport Ireland provided High Performance Programme Funding to 19 NGBs/Funded Bodies from 2021 to 2024. These organisations range from large to small in size (membership and athlete population), fully professional or semi-professional staffing models, and centralised or decentralised high performance programmes.

In September 2024, Sport Ireland invited NGBs to engage in the 2025-2028 High Performance Programme Funding process. There were a number of distinct outcomes of this process which achieves the principles set out in the High Performance Strategy 2021-2032:

- Multi-annual: Sport Ireland will proceed with multi-annual funding. The package of funding will increase from three years to four, covering the full Olympic/Paralympic Cycle (2025-2028).
- **Focused:** The number of sports identified as High Performance Programmes will reduce from 19 to 16.
- Inclusive: Sport Ireland will establish the Performance Development Programme which will allow for a more comprehensive but controlled approach to sports which have talented athletes and/or smaller or early-stage performance programmes.

The graph below summarises the investment from Sport Ireland to the high performance system over a 9-year period.

One year funding is allocated for Rowing Ireland and the Irish Athletic Boxing Association. This reflects the unique circumstances within each NGB. Sport Ireland will continue to engage with the NGBs with a view to agreeing funding requirements from 2026.

Sport Ireland provides a range of funding streams to Paralympics Ireland including High Performance Programme Funding (€1,000,000), Direct Athlete Support, (€307,000), and Administration and Operations Funding also know as HP Core Funding (€450,000). The 2025 "Core Funding" allocation is reflected in the table below.

One year funding is also allocated for Paralympics Ireland. An important strategic project is ongoing with Paralympics Ireland. This involves moving the swimming and athletics para sports programmes to Swim Ireland and Athletics Ireland, respectively. Sport Ireland is supporting Paralympics Ireland in this transition and have allocated additional resource to facilitate this project (€250,000). The long-term resourcing needs will be determined as this project progresses.

2025 Performance Development Programme

Sport Ireland is pleased to announce the allocation of up to €1m under the newly established Performance Development Programme. This initiative underscores Sport Ireland's commitment to fostering a more inclusive and sustainable high performance system, ensuring a broader range of NGBs can access targeted support to enhance their performance programmes and pathways.

The Performance Development Programme will be delivered to targeted NGBs. Building on the engagement and investment provided throughout the Paris Cycle, six NGBs will be included in this programme in 2025. As well as establishing a community of practice amongst these NGBs, they will receive support which is specific to their sport and reflective of their stage of development.

High Performance Coaching

Investment under High Performance Coaching will increase from €1.2m in 2024 to €1.5m in 2025. Sport Ireland has led improvements in the high performance coaching landscape and made progress in addressing the challenges which exist. To date, significant progress has been achieved, and Sport Ireland has accelerated the recruitment of coaches within NGBs. Sport Ireland's investment in the recruitment of talented individuals to key coaching positions is done on a sliding-scale basis over three or four years with Sport Ireland front-loading investment for 100% of the support in Year 1, with a year-on-year increasing investment by the NGB to ensure the medium-term viability of these positions and long-term retention by NGBs. Mentoring and training has also been a key feature of work in high performance coaching in 2024 and is targeted at both new and established coaches operating in the Irish system.

Sport Ireland developed a 'Women in High Performance Coaching Network' (WinHP) noting the more pronounced challenges in this area. High Performance Coaching has also been supported through the Pursuit of Excellence Programme, Mentor Development Programme and includes a new offering in 2025 for Performance Pathway Coaches. There has been strong buy-in to Sport Ireland's efforts in High Performance Coaching by the NGBs, and Sport Ireland will continue its work in this area in 2025.

In addition to providing financial support to NGBs, High Performance Coaching will offer additional support for the following programmes: the Sport Ireland Institute's Pursuit of Excellence Programme for coaches preparing for the LA 2028 and Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games, the Performance Pathway Coach & Mentor Development Programme, and the Women in High Performance Coaching Network.

2025 International Carding Scheme

The International Carding Scheme provides financial support to athletes for their training and competition programmes. The primary purpose of this funding is to support Irish athletes in reaching finals and achieving medals at European, World, Olympic and Paralympic level.

In 2025, Sport Ireland will invest €4.5m under the International Carding Scheme and the Player Funding Scheme. This will support 129 athletes and 11 relays/pool funding across 16 sports. Sport Ireland continues to support the Player Funding Scheme, and in 2025, an allocation of €450,000 will be allocated to Hockey Ireland to support players in its Senior Men and Senior Women's teams.

Ahead of the LA Cycle (2025-2028) Sport Ireland, alongside the NGBs, have reviewed and updated the International Carding Scheme criteria. The updated criteria reflects the progress of NGBs' High Performance Programmes and continued improved performances. Sport Ireland remains committed to supporting senior athletes at a level that is appropriate for their stage of development, and in a manner that enables them to continue to progress. Sport Ireland will provide funding on a one-year basis for 2025 and 2026. Multi-annual funding will be reintroduced for 2027 and 2028 as per the approach taken during the Tokyo and Paris Cycles. The Sport Ireland Institute provides world-leading services to Ireland's high performance carded athletes. It should be noted that the Direct Athlete Support Investment table does not capture the value of performance support services which is provided by the Sport Ireland Institute.

Improving the support to pathway athletes is a key recommendation for Sport Ireland and the NGBs in the Paris Cycle Review.

Over the LA Cycle, Sport Ireland will support and encourage NGBs to further develop their approach to the athlete pathway to ensure the pipeline of Irish talent remains strong and adequately supported at key points of the athletes' journey.



Athlete Wellbeing

The Sport Ireland Athletes' Lounge located on the Sport Ireland Campus has been developed to provide a private space and environment, exclusively for athletes. Within the lounge, athletes have access to various areas which allows opportunities for them to relax, socialise, study, and cook in between training and performance services appointments.

The Federation of Irish Sport appointed an Athlete Support Manager in September 2024. This new role, funded and supported by Sport Ireland, provides independent, confidential advice to athletes on various matters, including integrity, dispute resolution, and athlete welfare and wellbeing. The Athlete Support Manager will collaborate with NGBs to support the further development of athlete-centred high performance programmes.

The Sport Ireland Athlete Career Transition Programme (ACT), introduced in 2022, is world-leading in terms of its financial and service offerings to carded athletes upon retirement. Athletes availing of the ACT programme are guaranteed 50% of their current award from their point of exit from the International Carding Scheme. In an Olympic/Paralympic year, an athlete will receive the remainder of their funding for the year and secure 50% of their funding for the following year. The ACT programme provided support to 15 athletes in 2024, bringing the total number of athletes supported through this programme to 53 across the Paris Cycle.
